THE CHICAGO WEST PARK FRAUDS.

MORE RESPECTABLE CITIZENS ON THE ROAD TO JAIL—HENRY GREENEBAUM INDICTED FOR CONSPIRACY.

CHICAGO, Dec. 2 .- The Grand Jury yesterday took up the examination into West Park affairs, about which much has been heard of late through experts, pamphlets, and the press. A long array of witnesses was called and examined. The result of the investigation was discovered at last after the jury had filed into court and deposited 47 true bills against various well-known citizens. One was against Henry Greenebaum, George W. Stanford, and Eben F. Runyon, who were jointly indicted for con-spiracy by false pretenses to defraud the town of West Chicago out of \$60,000. The indictment contained four counts. The first count charged that they had conspired to fraudulently obtain \$30,000 worth of the property of the West Parks; the second count charged that they had conspired to obtain by fraud a large amount of money, the property of West Chicago, \$30,000 of which was in national banknotes and 30,000 in greenbacks; the third count charged the same conspiracy to obtain the same amount, but made the property that of the County of Cook, and the fourth count reiterated the charges, and fixed the ownership of the property in the West Park Commissioners as officers of public trust. Capiases for the arrest of all the indicted will be issued on Monday, and the rule is that such as cannot give bail must go to jail. Henry Greenebaum is President of the German National Bank and an

ex-Park Commissioner.
